

From the summit, you'll enjoy uninterrupted views of the Aletsch Glacier, part of the UNESCO World Heritage property Swiss Alps Jungfrau-Aletsch – and the majestic Alpine panorama. Welcome to the high-Alpine wonderland where there is snow 365 days a year. For more insight into the history of the Jungfrau Railway, visit Alpine Sensation.

The Matterhorn experience

Get up close and personal with the Matterhorn! The cog railway trundles up to Gornergrat, where peaks reach as far as the eye can see.

Nobody – not even the locals – can resist the pulling power of the mighty Matterhorn. The striking pyramid-shaped mountain is one of Switzerland's most visible icons. But there's more to see than meets the eye – the year-round viewing platform gazes out across 29 four-thousanders. Europe's highest open-air cog railway brings you to the summit in just 33 minutes, negotiating bridges, cutting through galleries and tunnels and passing through wildly beautiful forests of larch and Swiss stone pine.

Get ready for the royal treatment. This round trip unravels some of Switzerland's most captivating landscapes – right up to Rigi, the so-called "Queen of the Mountains".

From Lucerne, you'll glide across Lake Lucerne by boat to Vitznau, where Europe's oldest cog railway climbs up to Rigi Kulm, which is the highest peak in the Rigi massif at around 1,800 m. En route you could stop off at the Mineralbad spa, designed by star architect Mario Botta. At Rigi Kulm, a 360° panorama awaits, with views reaching across the Swiss Plateau to the Black Forest, the Vosges and the snow-capped Alps. You'll never want to leave, we swear.

Switzerland's most beautiful detours

Sometimes the winding road is the way to go. The BLS-Lötschberger and Centovalli Railways take you on detours to incredible views and attractions.

The Swiss like straight lines, but this scenic journey is anything but. The ride in the RegioExpress Lötschberger from Bern to Brig does not head through the Lötschberg Base Tunnel, but over a mountain route more than a century old. From Brig, it's just a short hop to Domodossola, where the Centovalli Railway chugs on to Locarno. On the approximately 50 km narrow gauge line, there is plenty to see and admire – around 83 bridges and viaducts, light-dappled chestnut forests and vines heavy with Ticinese Merlot grapes. This wine is best tasted on one of the many walks that thread through the region. Cheers!

En route you'll pass through the Three-Lakes region, which encompasses lakes Biel/Bienne, Murten and Neuchâtel. At the southern tip of Lake Biel is St Peter's Island, whose beauty once inspired Swiss philosopher and writer Jean-Jacques Rousseau.

Pure Alpine romance

Discover four of the most striking Swiss Alpine pass roads in a day on this scenic bus trip, which negotiates 8,000 m of altitude in total. Brace yourself for the ultimate Alpine road trip.

On the Grimsel Pass, you'll trundle past glittering reservoirs and enjoy arresting views. The Nufenen Pass, Switzerland's highest mountain pass road open to traffic, gets pulses racing. The Gotthard, nicknamed the "King of Mountain Passes", has been one of the most important north-south trans-Alpine routes since Roman times. En route to the Susten Pass, the bus crosses no fewer than 25 bridges and passes through just as many tunnels. There's so much to explore on the entire route – for instance the famous Steingletscher (Stone Glacier).



Excursion tips

- (1) Brienzer Rothorn a steam train and a blast from the past; the mountain track was never electrified
- (2) Ballenberg Open-Air Museum original buildings, old livestock breeds and traditional crafts
- (3) Reichenbach Falls close-ups of the wild stream and the mighty, 120-m-high Reichenbach Falls
- (4) Aare Gorge over tens of thousands of years, the Aare River has carved out this spectacular gorge that is 1.4 km long and up to 200 m deep
- (5) Grimselwelt a world of hydropower, mountain lakes and reservoirs, with cable cars, hanging bridges and an underground power station



The new Gotthard Base Tunnel brings southern and northern Europe that bit closer to Switzerland. And the pioneering flat route through the Swiss Alps is a shining example of sustainable mobility.



June 1882: Switzerland opens the world's longest railway tunnel

Switzerland was already making tracks in 1882 when it opened the Gotthard Tunnel, the world's longest railway tunnel. A feat of daring, the whole route passes through seven loop tunnels and over 205 bridges from German Switzerland to Ticino, taking in standouts like Wassen church, Schöllenen Gorge and the Devil's Bridge.

Late 2016: Switzerland once again opens the world's longest railway tunnel

Stretching 57 km, the new tunnel is a marvel of engineering, bringing Switzerland even closer to its neighbours. The trip through the Alps is set to take just 20 minutes, making the journey quicker, smoother and more comfortable.

The Gotthard route

The original Gotthard mountain route will coexist with the Gotthard Base Tunnel. The combination of old and new roads will make the Gotthard region an unmissable Swiss public transport highlight. The contrast between the historic mountain route and the innovative flat line through the Alps is striking.
